## Healthy start for new French sales company

FORTY-six horses were sold at an average of €10,037 and a median of €17,600 at the first sale held by Osarus, the new French sales company, at Hippodrome du Bequet in La Teste last weekend.

Fillies by Indian Rocket proved popular, and Cedric Boutin bought two by the sire, including the €34,000 sale-topper.

Already named Gooseley Lane, the filly was sold by Haras des Faunes and is out of the Listed-winning mare Gooseley Lane.

The aggregate was €464,700, and 67 per cent of horses offered were sold.
